Cationic, Water-Soluble Molecules to Prevent the Formation of Biofilms

Advantages:

- Kills bacteria and bacterial biofilms
- Safe to human cells
- Kills both bacteria, and biofilms
- Enhances the efficacy of existing antibiotics

Applications:

- Cystic Fibrosis treatment
- Antibiotic resistant bacteria
- Water treatment
- Treatment of mucoid pseudomonas
- Excels in photo-dynamic therapy

Description:

Bacterial biofilms associated with infections are an increasing problem for antibiotic treatments and deliv-ery techniques because they form a natural boundary that prevents delivery to the bacteria and infected site. The water-soluble molecules that are the subject of this technology are transition metal complexed porphyrins. These molecules are selectively uptaken in pathogenic bacteria, whereby the molecule kills the bacteria. Additionally, the molecule breaks down the protective barrier of the biofilms and attacks the bio-film's extracellular DNA. By breaking down and destroying the structural elements of the biofilm the mole-cule creates pathways that permeate the biofilm and selectively kill pathogenic bacteria. Although this mol-ecule works well alone, it also has the potential to increase the efficacy of existing antibiotics.
